

### **MEALS AT CONFERENCE**

We have agreed with The Hayes that meals will be provided as far as possible according to **LOAF** principles (**Lo**cally sourced, **O**rganically produced, **A**nimal friendly, **F**airly traded).

A meat option will **only be given** at the Saturday evening meal—please tick the box on the Booking Form to indicate if you would like this.

All other meals will be vegetarian (including dairy and eggs). The Hayes will do their best to accommodate any other dietary needs; please state these on your booking form.

A PACKED LUNCH can be booked for those who have to leave before lunch on Sunday; again please indicate on the Booking Form.

Your choices will be confirmed to you in the Pre-Conference Mailing which will be sent out in June.

# **Booking Terms and Conditions**

- Bookings are processed in the order they are received.
- 2. A booking is only accepted on receipt of the appropriate deposit.
- 3. Every effort is made to provide the type of room requested but this may not be possible due to limited accommodation.
- Low Income rate is heavily subsidised and is intended for those who would otherwise be unable to attend.
- 5. A discount of 5% <u>may</u> be claimed by families including up to 2 adults and children aged 3-18. (No charge for under 3).

- 6. Conference participants are requested to pay the balance due on their booking by the 1st June 2025.
- 7. Cancellations after 15th June 2025 will be liable for the basic accommodation costs unless the place can be filled.
- 8. Non-attenders who have failed to pay in full will also be liable for the basic accommodation costs.
- Each Adult booking received after 15th May
   2025 will be subject to a surcharge of £20.00 (does not apply to one day non-residents).

Please note that there are a limited number of spaces this year so we urge you to book as soon as possible!

As mentioned on the form, bookings after the 15th May incur a booking surcharge.
